City of River Falls Mayor Dan Toland's weekly video update  
Oct. 6, 2020

Hi, Mayor Dan here. It's that time of the year when the Packers begin their march to their next Superbowl championship. I would try to explain to the Viking fans out there what a championship is, but so far through four games, it looks like it would just be a waste of everyone's time. Seeing as the Packers have this weekend off – we all know they are the only real football team in this area that are worth watching – everyone should take some time and enjoy the nice weather. Get out and look at the fall colors. We all know they are not here for long. So, get out there and soak up the beauty of nature. It's good for the soul!

Now, let's look at the weekly COVID-19 case numbers ...

In the first slide, you will see that Pierce County has 37 active cases, a decrease of 22 since last week. The cumulative case total for the county is 478. The activity level is high.

In this next slide, you can see that St. Croix County has 419 active cases, an increase of 125 since last week. The cumulative case total is now 1,103. St. Croix County's activity level is also high.

Slide three shows us that there are 24,000 active cases in Wisconsin, an increase of 5,030 cases since last week.

On slide four, you'll see that Pierce County continues to be able to contact new cases within 24 hours. However, they are not able to trace all close contacts within 24 hours.

Now, on to some other news ...

I want to let you know that new electric rates will be reflected in your November bill for October usage. This rate adjustment is only the second in 20 years – the latest occurred in 2008. The new rates will help us continue to provide quality, reliable service you have come to trust and expect. We have made a series of significant investments in our substations and the distribution system that delivers power to your homes and businesses.

As I mentioned last week, Lake Louise has been drawn down so that we can look at the Powell Falls Dam, which was damaged during the June 29<sup>th</sup> flood. Please stay out of the lakebed as the thick mud and debris can be hazardous.

The City was well into its hydro relicensing process when the flood came through. That process included decommissioning the Powell Falls hydroelectric facility and removing the dam in 2026. Well, the November election is just 29 days away. If you haven't voted yet, there are three ways to do it:

- Request an absentee ballot at [myvote.wi.gov](http://myvote.wi.gov). Once you've received your ballot, fill it out and return it by mail or place it in the drop boxes at City Hall. It must be received by November third, barring any extension the state may implement.
- Vote early and in person at City Hall from October 20 to October 30. Check the City's election webpage below for more information.
- And, of course, you can always vote in person on Election Day, we will have everything ready to go for you on November third. Check your polling place at the site below ([www.rfcity.org/elections](http://www.rfcity.org/elections)).
